### What is the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)?

The Southern California Association of Governments' 2008 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) is a 25-year plan that provides a vision for transportation investments in the SCAG region using an assessment of growth and economic trends over the next 25 years.

### How will the upcoming RTP impact me?

The RTP provides long-range regional strategies to enhance the movement of people, goods and information. By doing so, the region may enhance its economic growth, international trade and improve the environment and quality of life. The wide range of issues and impacts of the RTP will be experienced by all citizens of the SCAG region.

### Who collaborates with SCAG in developing the RTP?

Input and consensus are crucial when developing a plan that impacts the efficient movement of people and goods across six counties and 187 cities. Guiding SCAG staff through development are numerous task forces, local governments and subregions, county transportation commissions, Caltrans, state and federal agencies, environmental and business communities, tribal governments, non-profit groups, the general public and others.

### What information is included in the RTP?

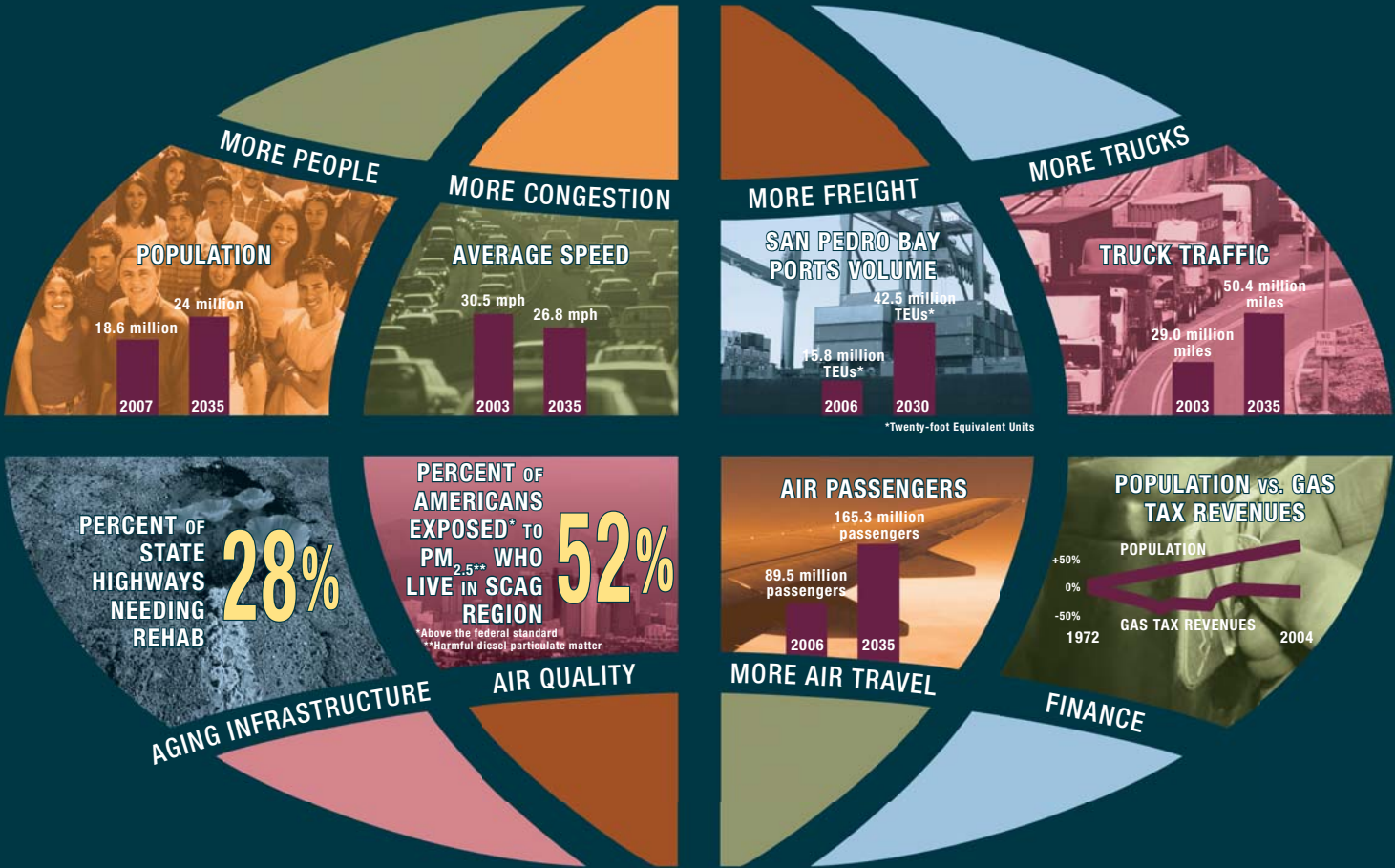
SCAG's RTP is a required document for the region to qualify for future federal, state, and local funding of projects.

Some of the topics covered in the document include:

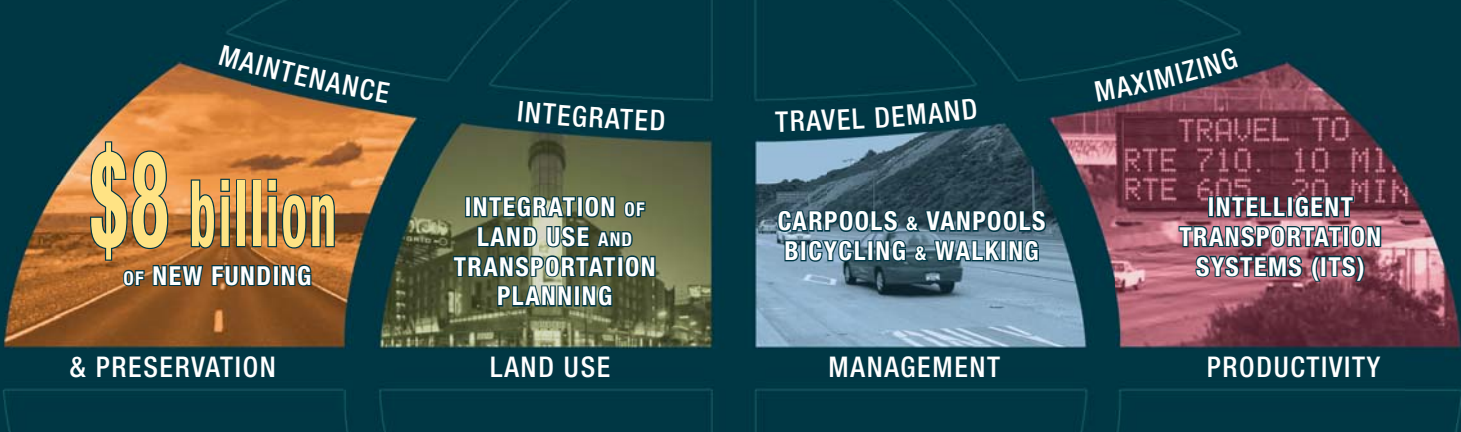
