## City of Anaheim

### Platinum Triangle

The Platinum Triangle supports the region's transportation investments by focusing future growth in key activity centers and transportation corridors.

Project SHAPE supports long-term prosperity by encouraging infill development that preserves the downtown's historic character and creates a people-oriented economic hub for a rapidly growing part of our region.
