CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Honorable Frank Yokoyama called the meeting to order at 9:32 a.m. and asked Councilmember John Mirisch, City of Beverly Hills, to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

Vice Chair Yokoyama provided detailed instructions on the updated public comment protocols and opened the public comment period. He noted the total time for all public comments related to items on the agenda and any other matter within the agency's subject matter jurisdiction was a minimum of five (5) minutes and the public comment period would be held open for at least 5 minutes to afford the public the ability to comment on all items on this agenda. Additional comments clarifying the new five (5) minute public comment period was explained in detail by Michael Houston, SCAG's Chief Counsel.

Vice Chair Yokoyama thanked everyone for participating remotely and asked anyone on their computers to speak by using the "raise hand" function on the computer and/or wait for SCAG staff to announce their name or phone number. Additionally, he noted that public comments received via email to CEHDPublicComment@scag.ca.gov after 5pm on November 3, 2021, would be announced and included as part of the official record of the meeting.

SCAG staff noted there were no written public comments received by email before or after the 5pm deadline on Wednesday, November 3, 2021, or via hands raised.

Seeing no public comments, Vice Chair Yokoyama closed the public comment period.

INFORMATION ITEMS

3. SB 743 Implementation Strategies – Developer Panel

Vice Chair Yokoyama provided background details on the subject of SB 743 Implementation Strategies. He noted that Senate Bill 743 changed the focus of the CEQA methodology for assessing transportation impacts from motor vehicle delay to vehicle miles traveled (VMT) reduction. Since taking effect in July of last year, local jurisdictions throughout the state have been required to conduct a VMT analysis for new developments as part of the CEQA process. SCAG has been working closely with regional stakeholders over the past several years to help ensure the successful transition to the new VMT-based methodology.

Vice Chair Yokoyama asked Michael Gainor, SCAG staff, to facilitate the discussion and to provide introductions of the two panelist who would share some of their experiences in navigating SB 743 requirements in the development of projects.

Mr. Gainor provided brief introductions of the two panelist and introduced to the Committee Alex Valente, Senior V.P., Trammell Crow and Alfred Fraijo Jr., Partner, Sheppard Mullin. He thanked each of the speakers for their participation.

Each panelist shared their presentations, which included an overview of case studies, recommendations, and shared perspectives to help local jurisdictions ensure the successful transition for positive outcome implementations of the new VMT-based methodology.

The panelists also responded to questions and comments from the Councilmembers, including questions regarding perspectives on CEQA reform and opportunities for alternative mitigation measures required to fully realize the VMT reduction potential for local communities. Additional comments focused on the VMT impact of specific development projects and interest for more SB 743 studies that relate to the real-world impacts on outlined communities, such as the city of Yucaipa.



The comprehensive staff report, including PowerPoint presentations, was included in the agenda packet. A recording of the meeting, including the presentations, can be found on SCAG's website.

4. Connect SoCal 2024 Preliminary Regional Growth Ranges for 2050

Vice Chair Yokoyama provided a brief introduction. He asked Kevin Kane, SCAG staff, to provide some background information on the framework, and then turn the presentation over to Beth Jarosz of the Population Reference Bureau, who would provide a preliminary update on the Connect SoCal 2024 Preliminary Regional Growth Ranges for 2050.

Ms. Jarosz's presentation included an overview of the Regional Economics and Demographic Forecast process for the SCAG region. Highlights of the presentation included scenarios such as regional growth ranges and assumptions that drive the regional baseline, including baseline population and job growth.

Staff noted that the RTP/SCS wass generally adopted at the local jurisdictional level and that there are uniform factors used for county data input and growth assumptions.

The comprehensive staff report and the PowerPoint presentation were included in the agenda packet.

Vice Chair Yokoyama thanked the team for their presentation and asked staff to work with Chair Marquez to bring back topics of interest concerning VMT and alternative mitigation measures.

5. Orange County Equity Map and Social Progress Index

Vice Chair Yokoyama provided background information of the Orange County Equity Map and Social Progress Index data tools. He asked Katie Kalvoda, President and Board Chair of AdvanceOC, to provide a report on this resource and present how it was being used in local jurisdictions to advance equity.

Ms. Kalvoda's presentation included an overview of Advance OC's mission, and how they aim to address opportunity disparities as they relate to the systemic health, housing and education challenges within the Orange County communities. Highlights of the presentation included a variety of baseline and inter-active tools that build on social progress data collection and indicators for the Orange County communities.

Vice Chair Yokoyama thanked Ms. Kalvoda for her presentation.



The comprehensive staff report and PowerPoint presentation were included in the agenda packet.

CHAIR'S REPORT

Vice Chair Yokoyama encouraged everyone to attend the upcoming 12th Annual Southern California Economic Summit, and asked Jonathan Hughes, SCAG staff, to provide additional details.

STAFF REPORT

Jonathan Hughes, SCAG staff, announced that the 12th Annual Southern California Economic Summit would take place on Thursday, December 2, 2021, and that the event would take place virtually. He noted that additional details were on SCAG's website and encouraged everyone to register for the event.

Mr. Hughes also reported on SCAG's \$23 million Regional Early Action Planning (REAP) grant and the additional five percent that was being made available to SCAG's subregional organizations.

A report on VMT and alternative mitigation measures was requested.
