3.1 Answers to Tough Mobility Questions through the help of iPeMS Analytics - A series of Southern California Case Studies

Mahmoud Ahmadi & Tiffany Barkley, Iteris 40 minutes

This presentation will cover a number of examples of iPeMS analytics applied for agencies in Southern California. Case studies will include the use of big data and analytics in Congestion Management Programs, to support forecasting, and to evaluate the transportation system's response to special or events or emergencies.

3.2 An Update to SCAG's External Heavy Duty Truck Model using Firm Synthesis and Supply Chain Modeling Techniques

Colin Smith & Kaveh Shabani, RSG

The presentation will introduce the recent update to SCAG's external heavy duty truck model. The model makes use of disaggregate freight modeling techniques including firm synthesis and supply chain modeling to simulate the movement of freight and trucks into and out of the SCAG region. The presentation will describe the new model components and cover preliminary base and future year results.

3.3 Imperial County Transportation Model Enhancement

CS worked with SCAG, Caltrans, and Imperial County jurisdictions to update the Imperial County Transportation Model (ICTM). The new model builds on previous efforts and uses SCAG's Subregional Model Development Tool (SMDT) to incorporate the latest regional planning data and assumptions. The latest version includes a new external trip distribution step that better represents travel patterns unique to Imperial County and its three border crossings. The model system also includes a dashboard and reporting system that was useful in model validation efforts and will also streamline model application.
