CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

INFORMATION ITEMS

4. REAP 2021: Draft Programs to Accelerate Transformative Housing

Chair Yokoyama made opening comments and asked Jacob Noonan, SCAG staff, to provide a presentation of the draft Programs to Accelerate Transformative Housing (PATH).

Mr. Noonan's presentation provided a brief overview of the REAP 2021 PATH program, which was developed with regionwide input received through ongoing broad and inclusive engagement and is one of the three major funding areas in SCAG's REAP 2.0 Program Development Framework, adopted by the Regional Council at its July 7, 2022 meeting.

Highlights of the 2021 REAP 2.0 draft PATH PowerPoint presentation included:

- Draft PATH Program
- Proposed Evaluation Criteria
- Tentative Timeline and Next Steps

Chair Yokoyama opened the public comment period and recognized Ms. Lucy Dunn, Member of the Public and ex officio business representative to the Regional Council and Executive/Administration Committee, who asked staff to consider distinguishing private housing trusts from public housing trusts due to the different rules. Chair Yokoyama then closed the public comment period.

SCAG staff responded to comments and questions expressed by the Councilmembers, including observations that focused on additional considerations for the PATH program such as prefab modular housing, longer term strategies for land banking, addressing preservation and displacement infrastructure, implementation of affordable housing and land trust, and identifying publicly owned land for affordable housing development.



The comprehensive staff report, the REAP 2021 draft PATH Program, and the PowerPoint presentation were included in the agenda packet.

5. Neighborhood Mobility Areas

Chair Yokoyama provided a brief summary of the draft Neighborhood Mobility Areas (NMAs) and noted that the regional approach to neighborhood mobility can help improve Connect SoCal 2024 mobility and air quality outcomes. He asked Lyle Janicek, SCAG staff, to provide the presentation.

Mr. Janicek's presentation included background information on Priority Development Areas (PDAs), highlights of the components of NMAs, the draft Neighborhood Mobility Area Allocations, and the NMA Methodology. Mr. Janicek provided information on the NMA next steps, which include integration into the placemaking strategies of Connect SoCal 2024.

Chair Yokoyama opened the public comment period and recognized Ms. Lucy Dunn, Member of the Public and ex officio business representative to the Regional Council and Executive/Administration Committee who provided comments in support of the NMA program. Chair Yokoyama then closed the public comment period on this item.

SCAG staff responded to comments and questions expressed by the Councilmembers, including comments that offered both support for the 15-minute city and NMAs, and consideration for balance and other factors as they relate to NMAs in certain rural communities.

The comprehensive staff report and PowerPoint presentation were included in the agenda packet.

6. REAP Call for Collaboration Program Update

Chair Yokoyama made opening comments providing a summary of the Call for Collaboration Program. He asked Alisha James, SCAG staff, to share more about the success of the program.

Ms. James provided background information and a brief summary of the Call for Collaboration Program that was funded by the Regional Early Action Planning (REAP) grant. Ms. James' presentation included an overview of program goals, objectives, and accomplishments. She introduced panelists Melanie Steele, Program Director, Inland SoCal Housing Collective and Gabrielle Vignone, Executive Director, House Farm Workers, who shared highlights of their experiences, project updates and successes of the grant program.

There were no public comments on this item.

The comprehensive staff report and PowerPoint presentations were included in the agenda packet.



CHAIR'S REPORT

Chair Yokoyama provided details regarding SCAG's Member and Public Participation protocols. He noted that the November EAC would include a discussion and provide direction on increasing in-person participation, starting with the January Regional Council and Policy Committee meetings.

STAFF REPORT

SCAG staff Jonathan Hughes provided a brief report that included information regarding SCAG cosponsored events throughout the region.

Mr. Hughes announced that the 13th annual Southern California Economic Summit would take place on Thursday, December 1, 2022 at the Sheraton Grand, Downtown Los Angeles. He encouraged everyone to register for the in-person event, noting that elected officials and city managers attend free.
