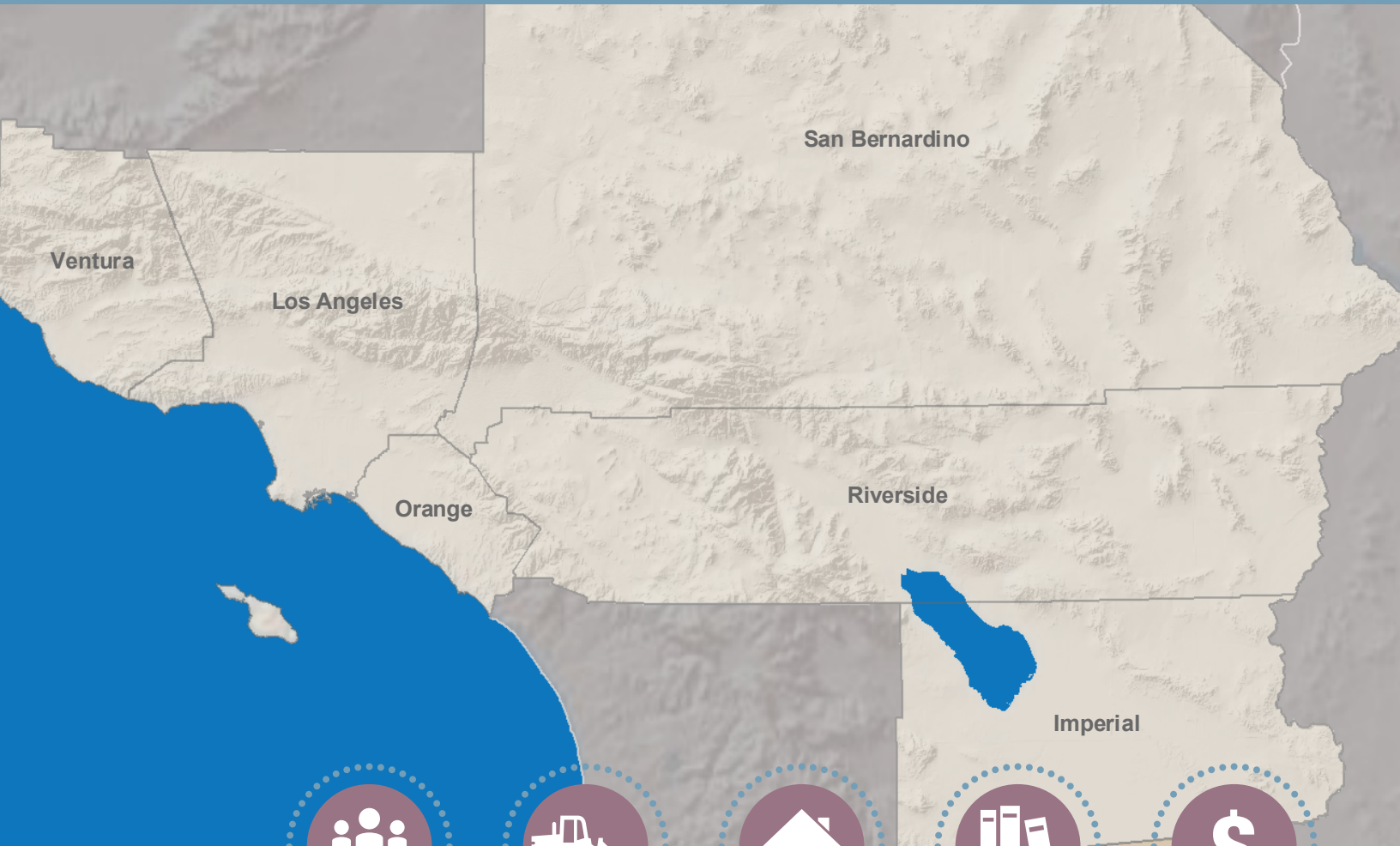

Employment

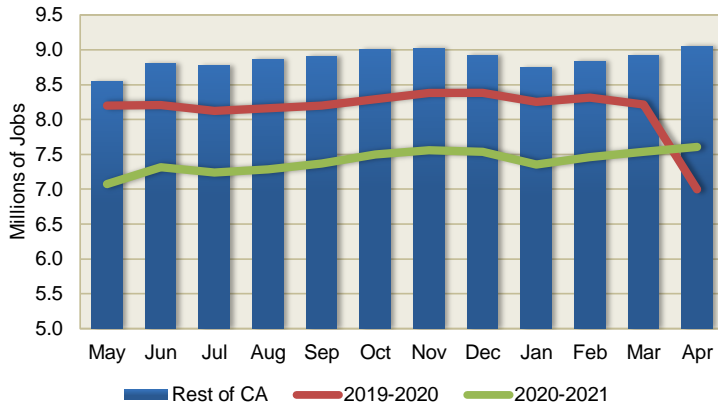

From Previous Year

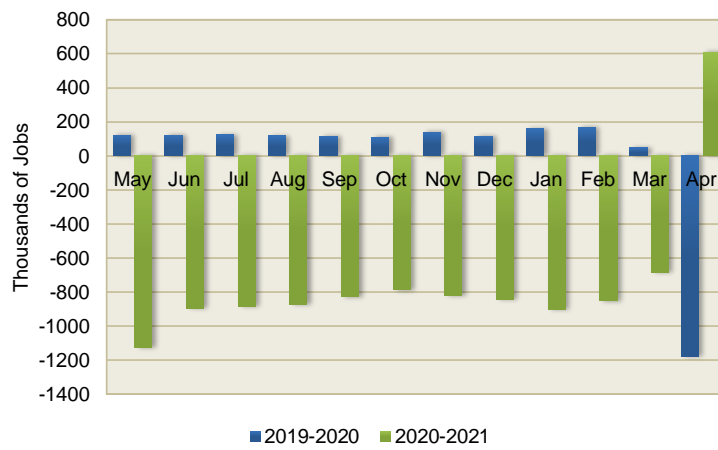

2020-2021

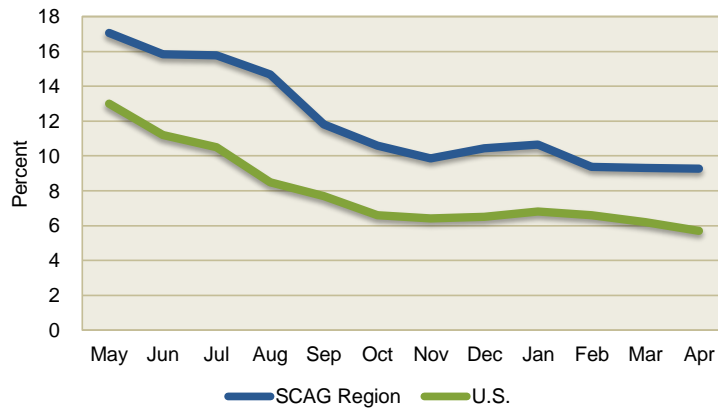
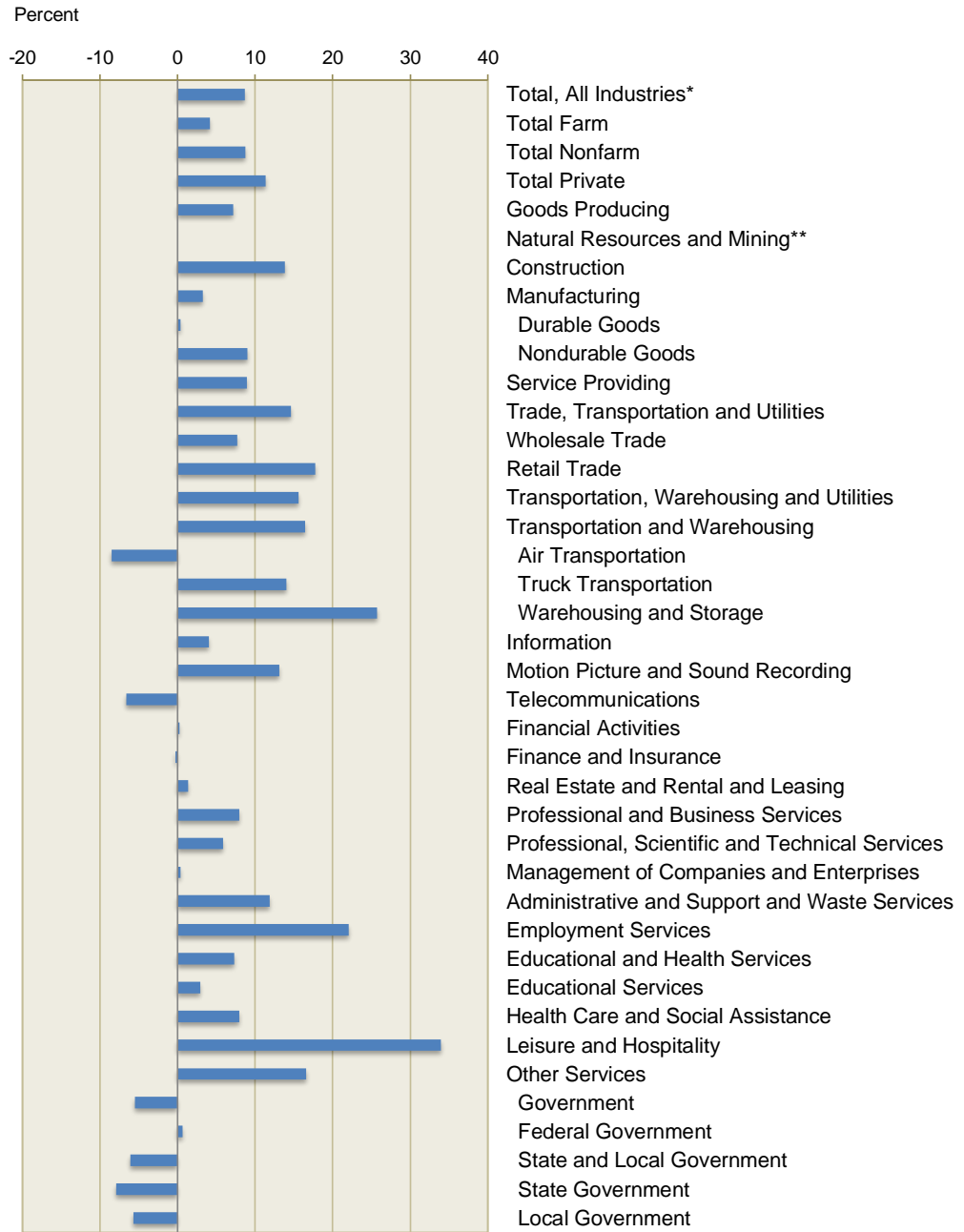

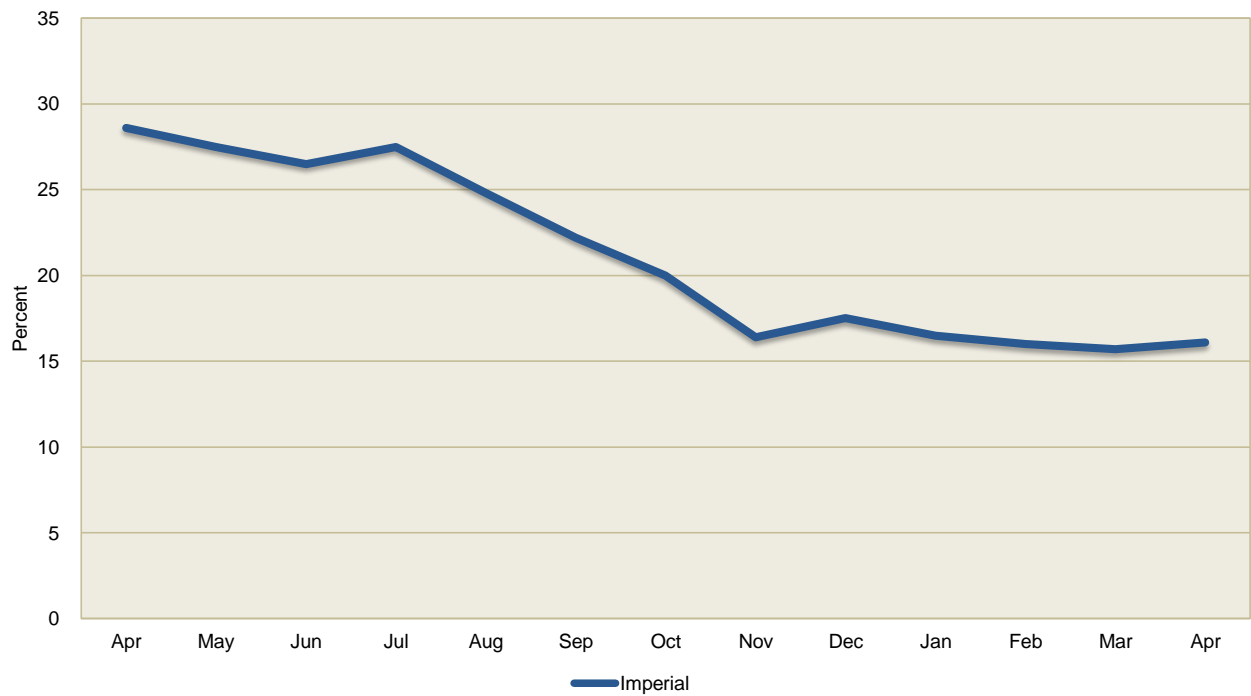
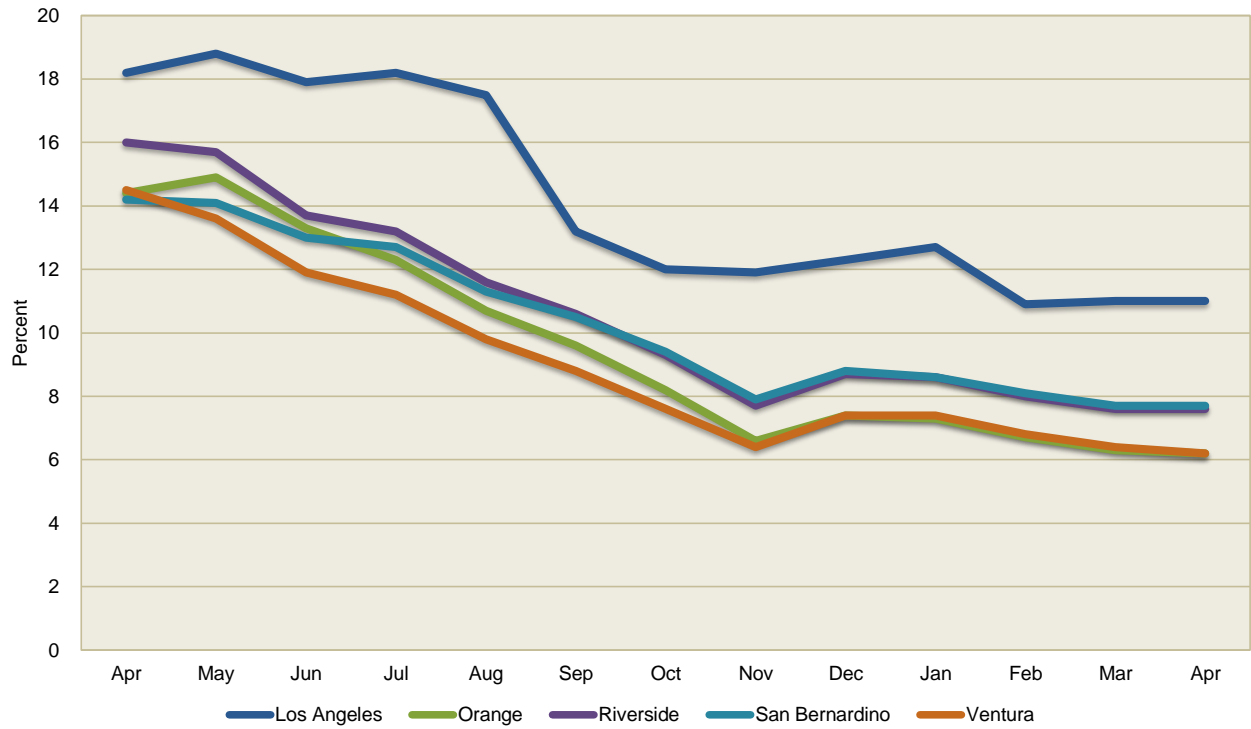

2019-2021

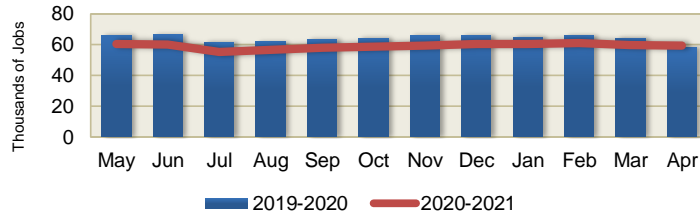


FIGURE 6-2

From Previous month

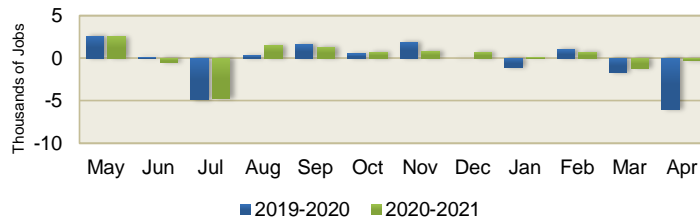

From Previous year

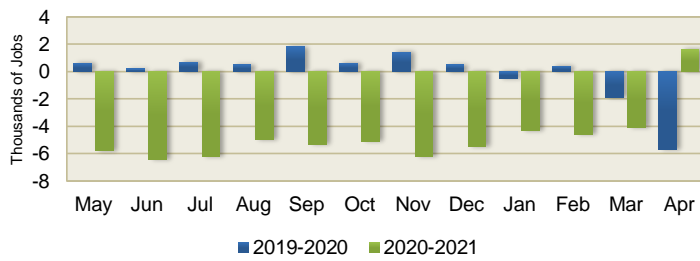

2020-2021

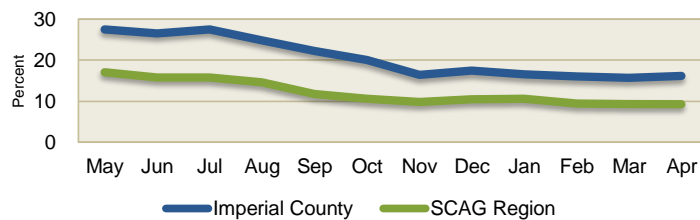

2019-2021

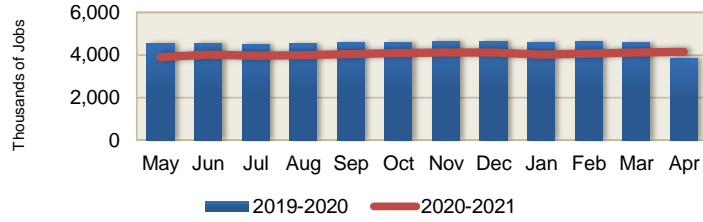


FIGURE 7-2

From Previous month

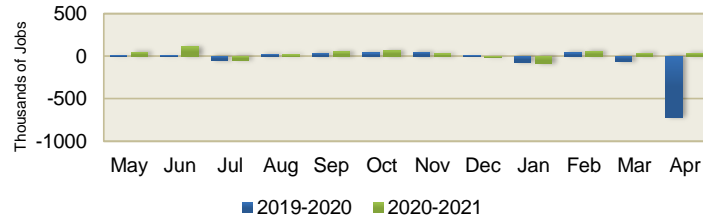

From Previous year

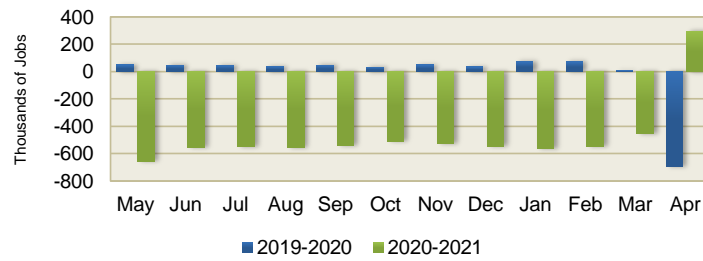

2020-2021

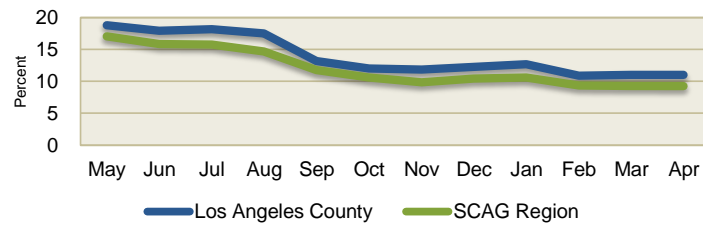

2019-2021

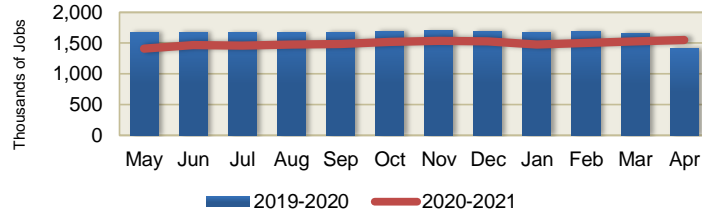


FIGURE 8-2

From Previous month

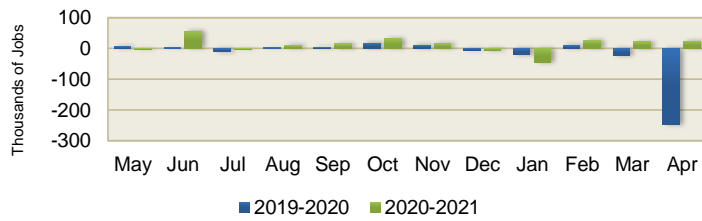

From Previous year

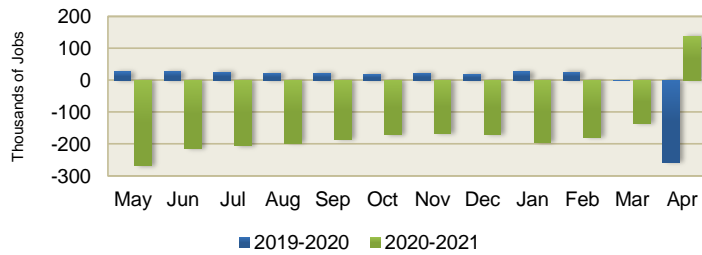


FIGURE 8-4

2020-2021

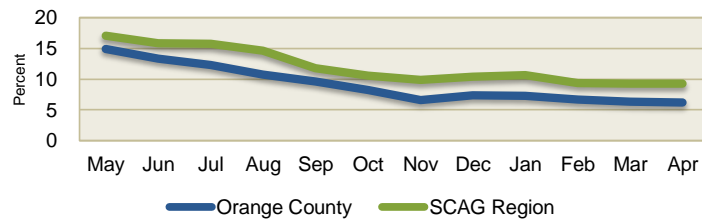


FIGURE 9-1

2019-2021

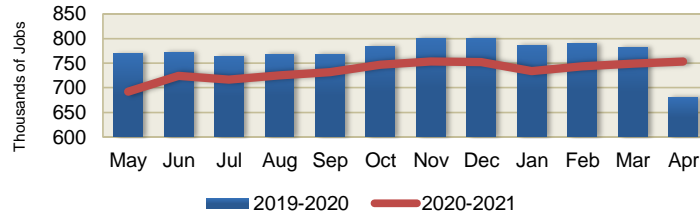


FIGURE 9-2

From Previous month

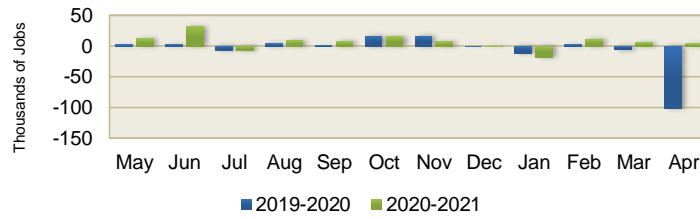

From Previous year

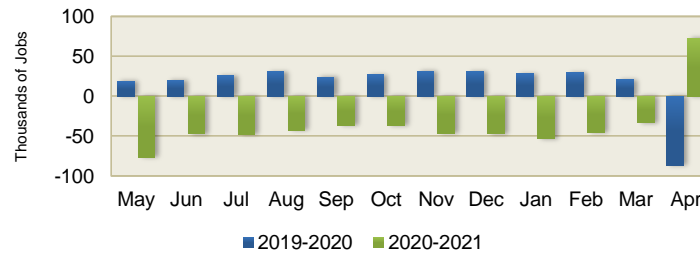

2020-2021

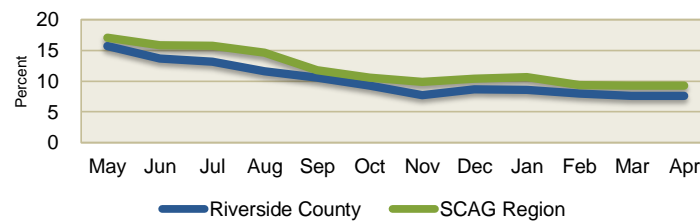

2019-2021

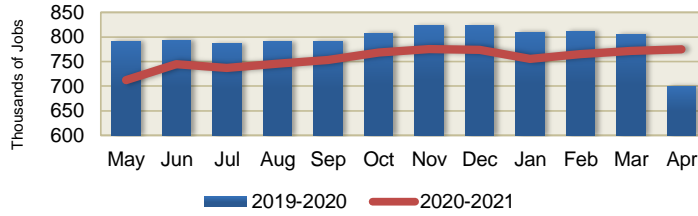

From Previous month

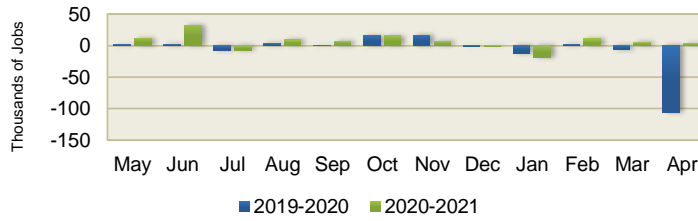

(Thousands of Jobs)

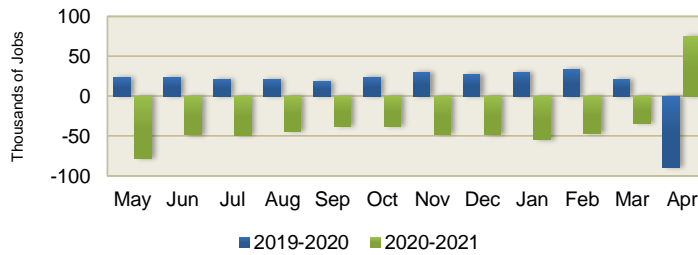

2020-2021

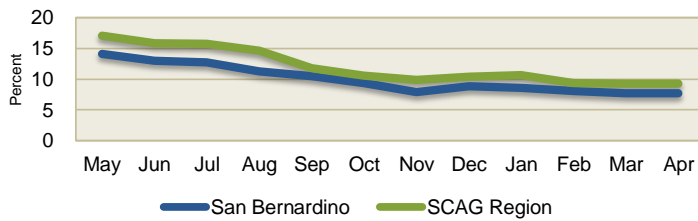


FIGURE 11-1

2019-2021

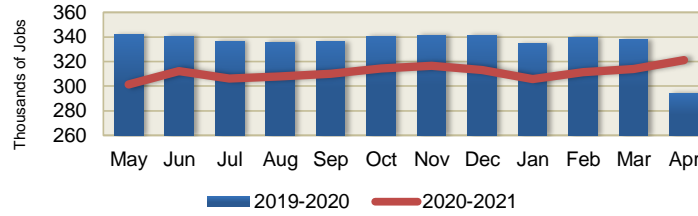


FIGURE 11-2

From Previous month

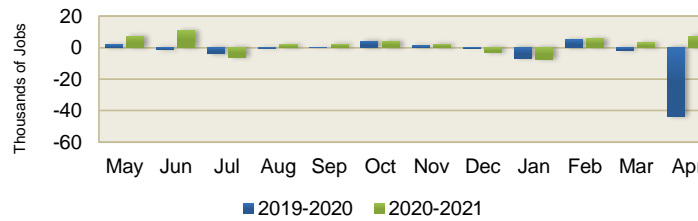

From Previous year

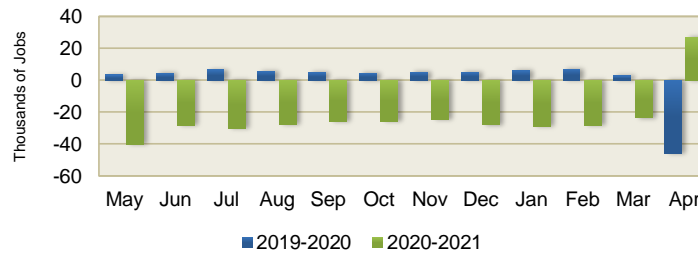
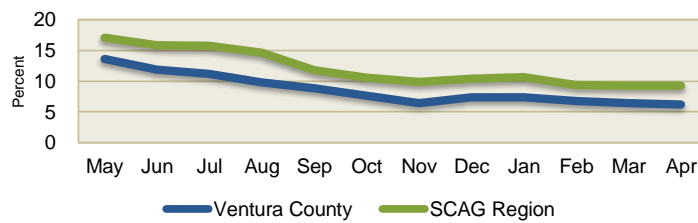

Single Family

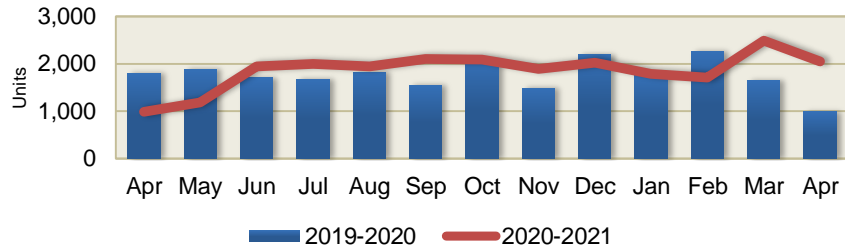

Multi Family

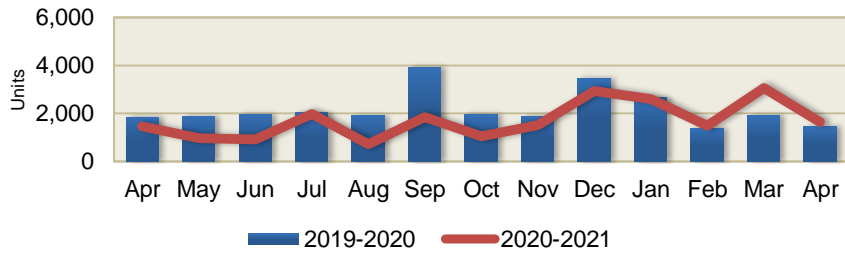

Building Permits

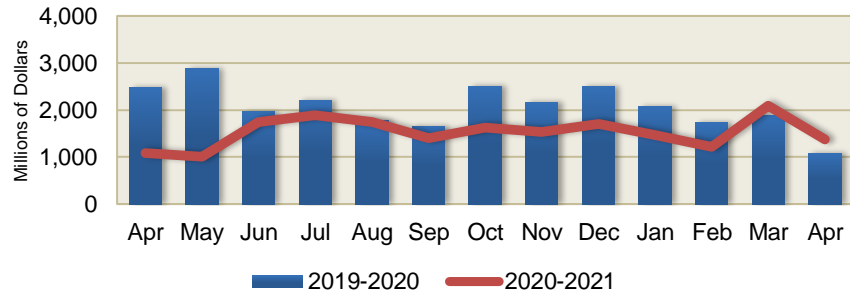

Valuation of Residential Building Permits

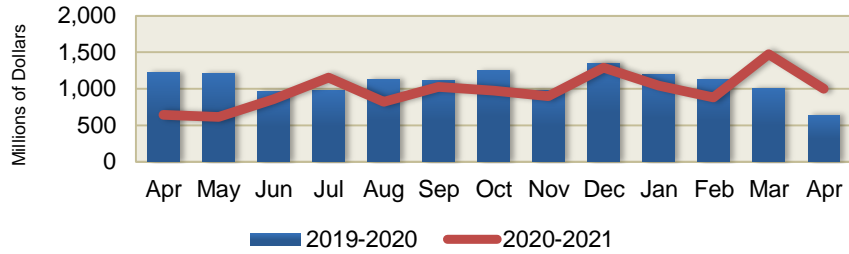

Valuation of Commercial Building Permits

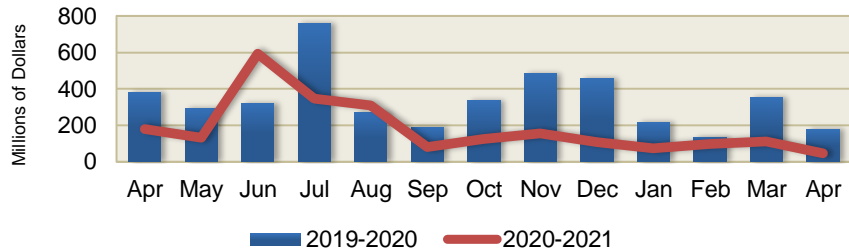

Valuation of Industrial Building Permits

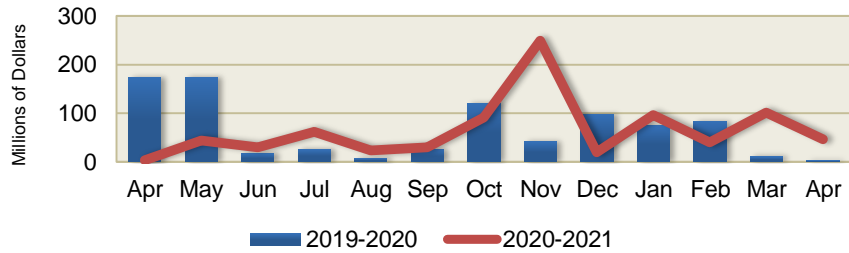

Valuation of Other Building Permits

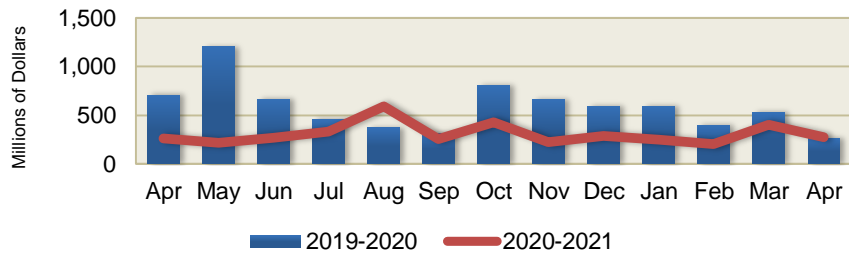

2020-2021

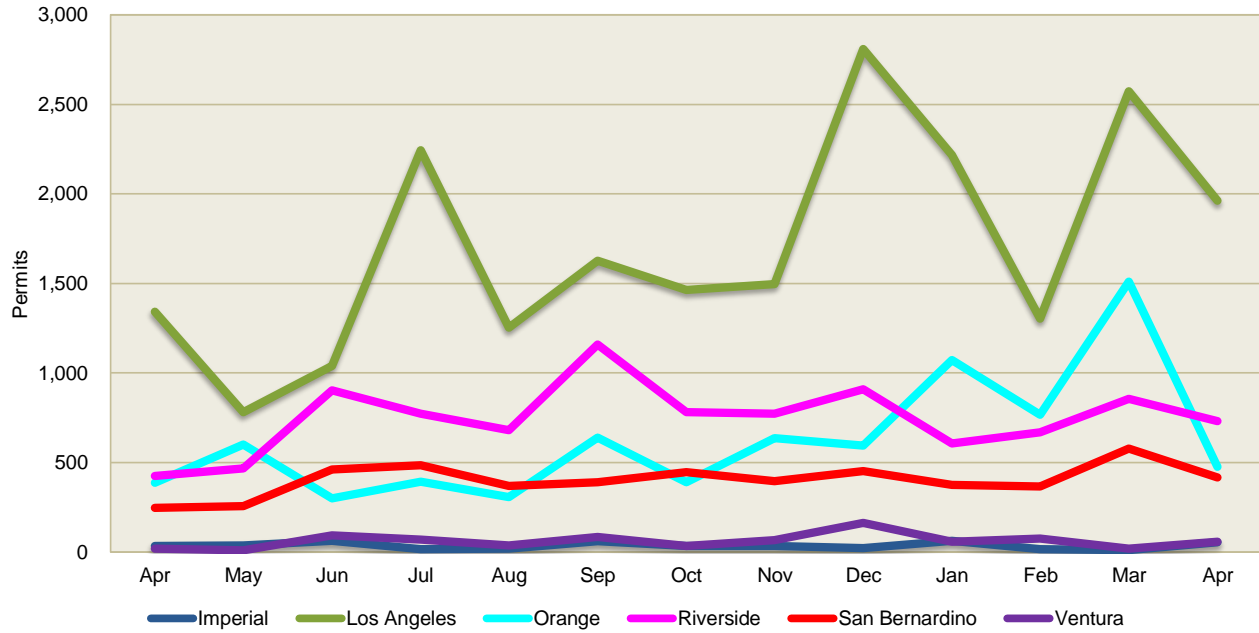

2020-2021

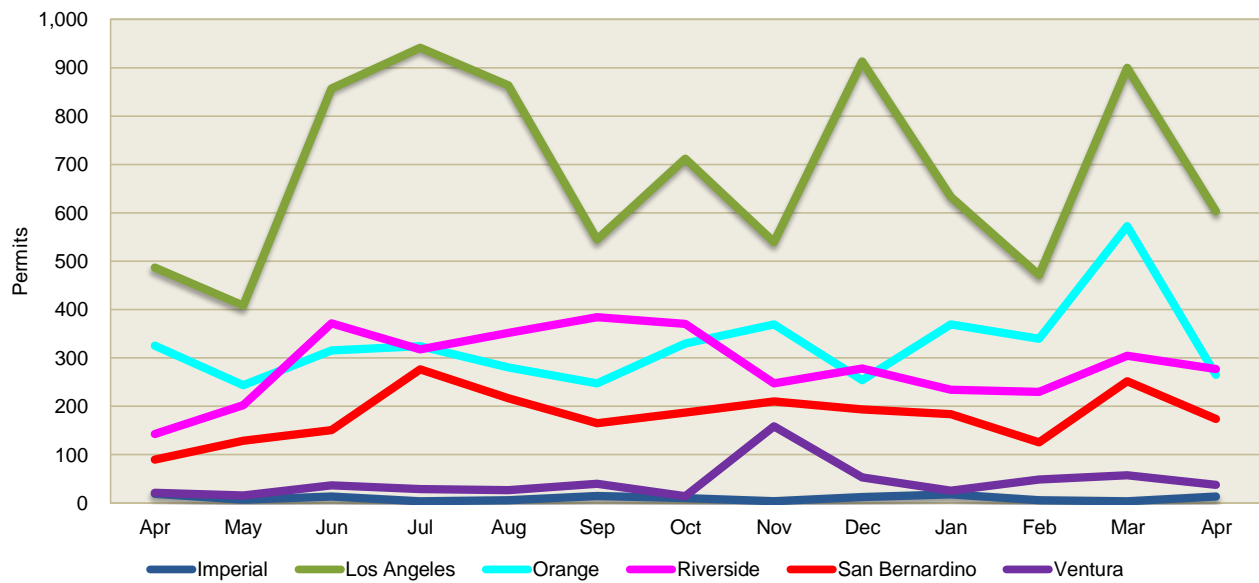

2020-2021

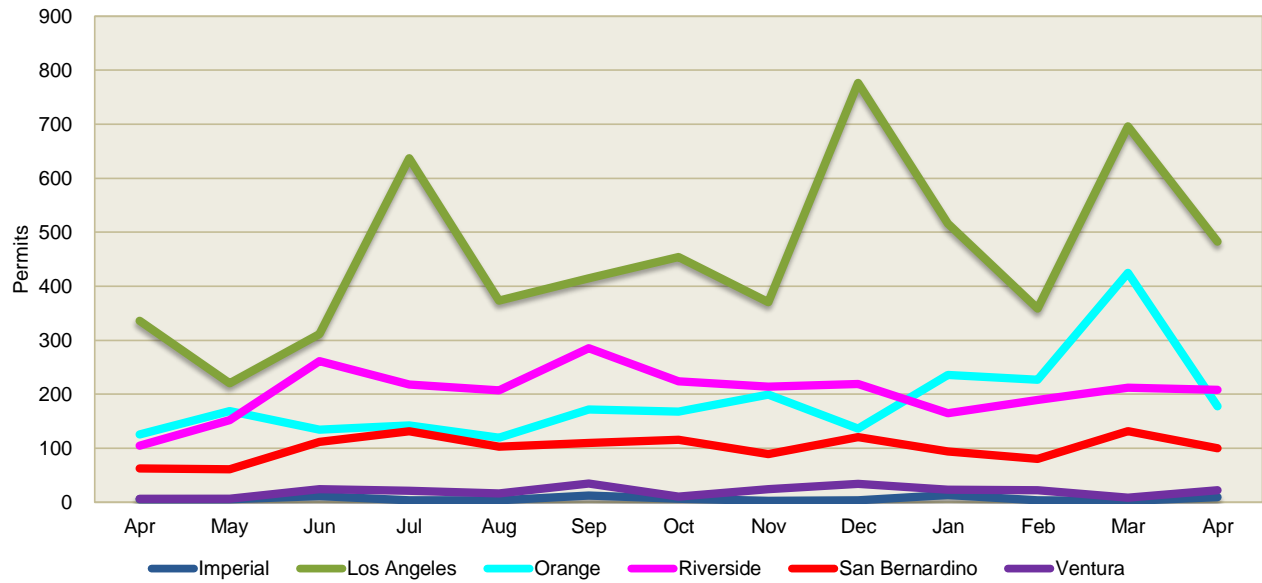

2020-2021

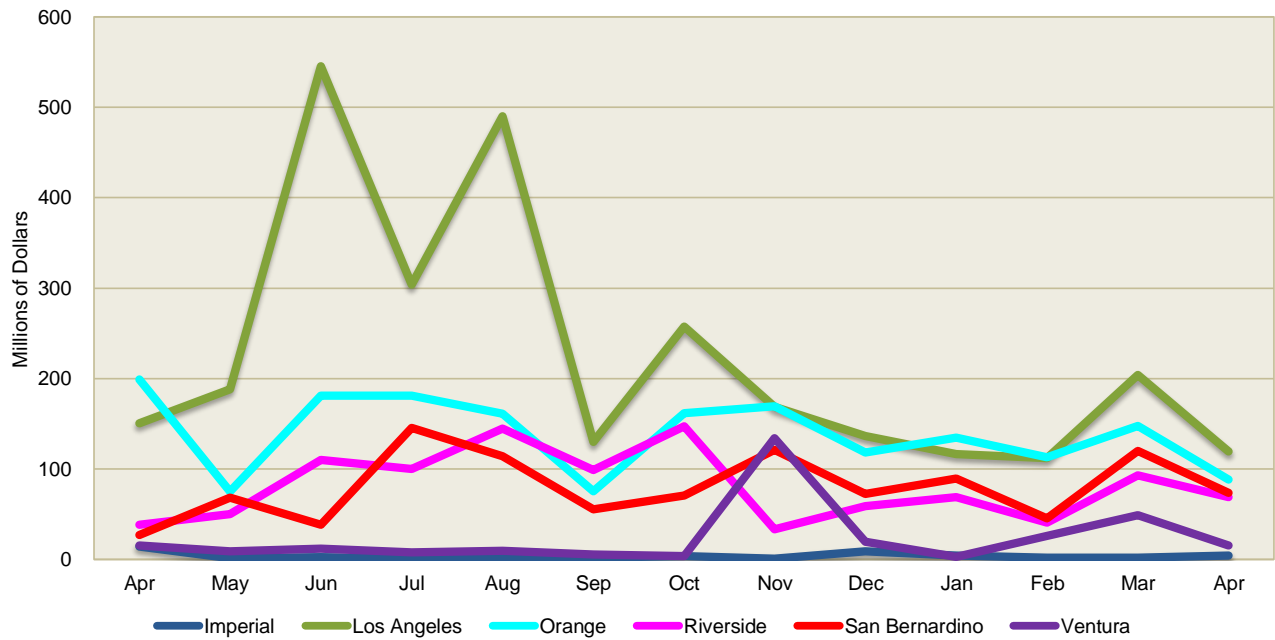

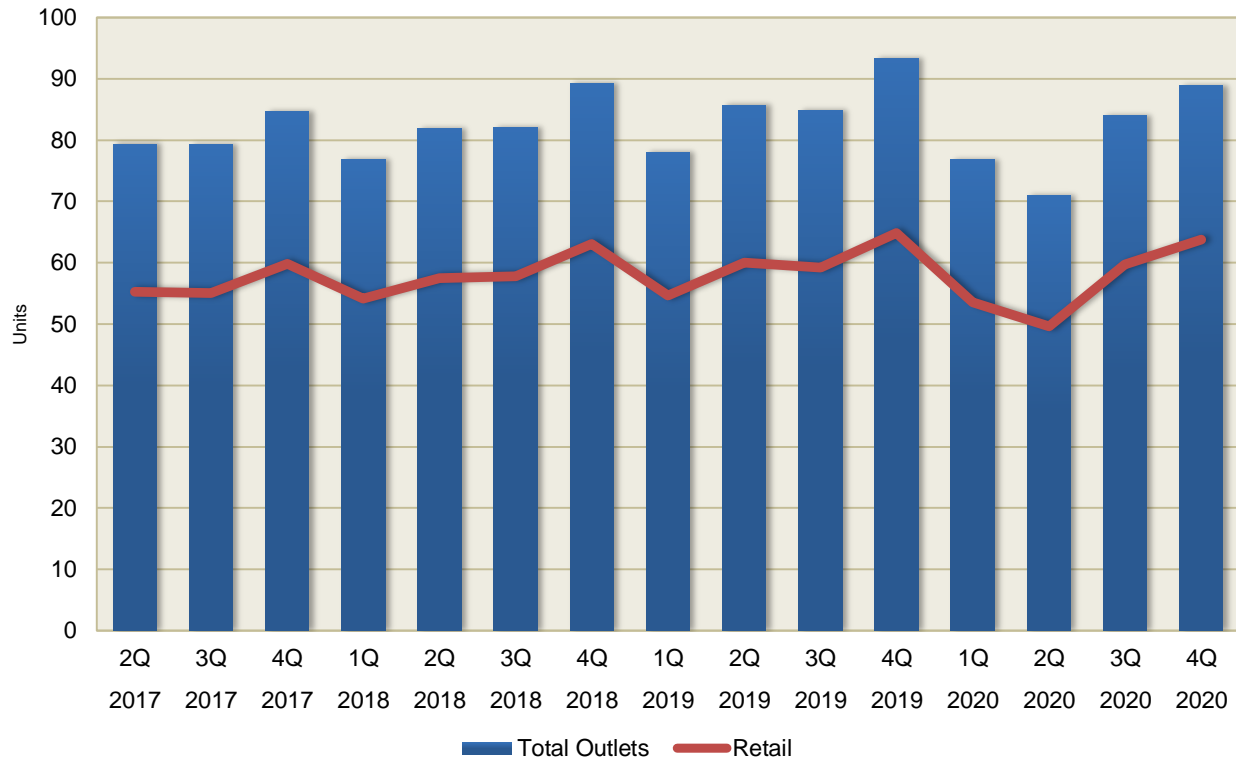

2017-2021

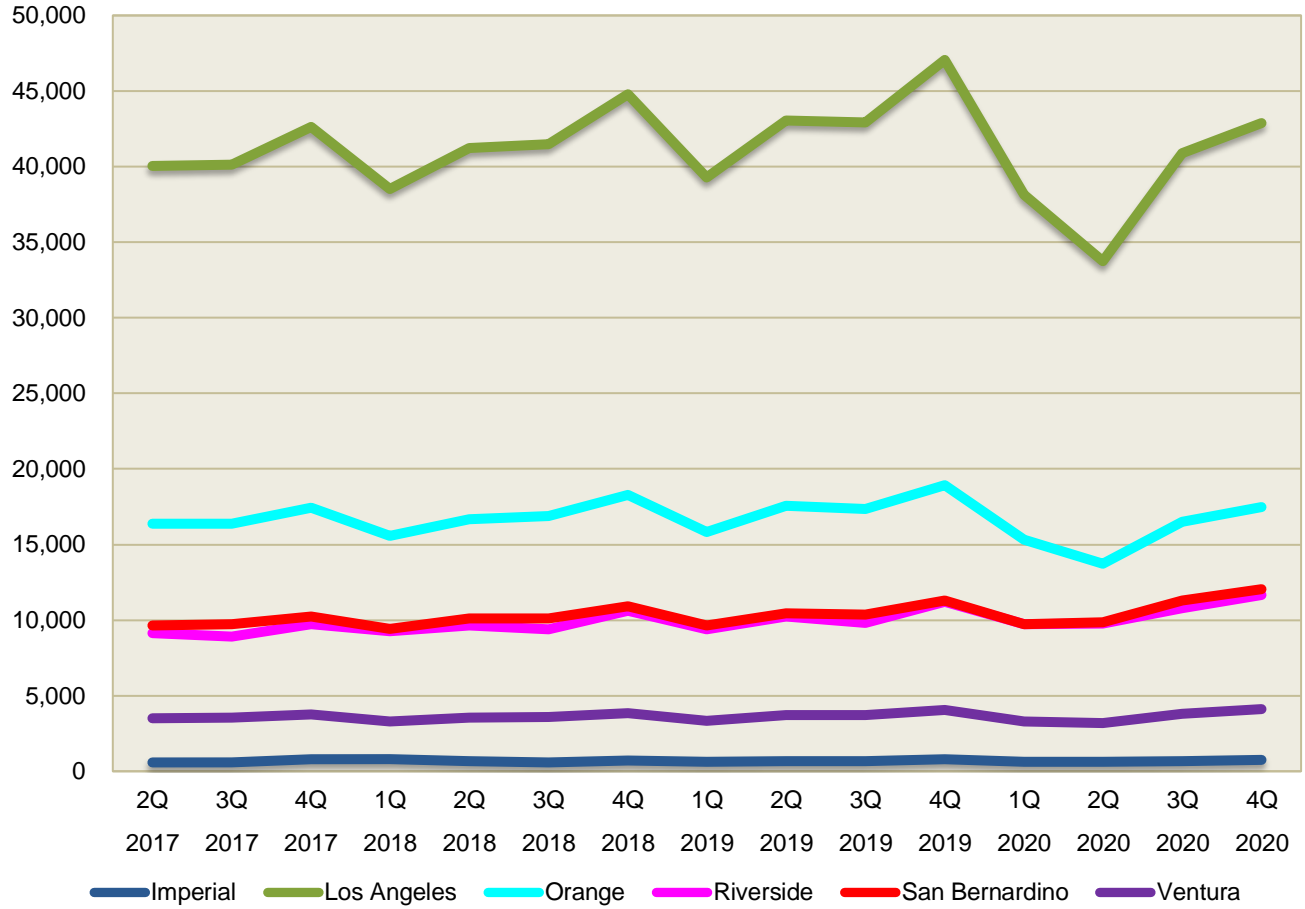
