1.0 CALL TO ORDER AND SELF-INTRODUCTION

Rongsheng Luo, SCAG, called the meeting to order at 10:05 am.

2.0 <u>PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD</u>

There were no public comments.

3.0 <u>CONSENT CALENDAR</u>

- 3.1 <u>TCWG April 28, 2015 Meeting Minutes</u> The meeting minutes were approved.

4.0 **INFORMATION ITEMS**

4.1 Review of PM Hot Spot Interagency Review Forms TCWG Discussion

1) LA0G949Rev

It was reaffirmed that this is not a POAQC.

2) **RIV151001**

It was determined that this is not POAQC (Updated truck volumes on Highway 111 were provided after the meeting).

3) **RIV111202**

It was determined that this is not a POAQC.

4.2 <u>Review of PM Hot Spot Qualitative/Quantitative Analyses</u>

1) **ORA100511Memo**

It was reaffirmed that the analysis remains acceptable for NEPA circulation with the revised traffic volumes.

2) 18790SR-710Protocol

Andrew Yoon, Caltrans District 7, presented an overview of the modeling protocol. TCWG discussed but needs additional review time and will provide comments after meeting.

4.3 <u>FTIP Update</u>

John Asuncion, SCAG, reported the following:

- All 2015 FTIP Amendments have been approved except Amendment #15-09 which has received state approval and was under federal review for approval.
- Draft 2017 FTIP Guidelines is scheduled to be presented to TCWG in August 2015.

4.4 <u>RTP Update</u>

Daniel Tran, SCAG, reported the following:

- SCAG staff has concluded a series of 22 RTP/SCS public workshops throughout SCAG region. Valuable feedbacks have been received from stakeholders, partner agencies, and the public. Feedbacks received will be incorporated into upcoming RTP/SCS.
- SCAG staff continues modeling and is drafting content for Draft 2016 RTP/SCS.

In response to a question, Mr. Tran clarified that 2016 RTP/SCS will first go to SCAG's Regional Council for adoption and then go to FHWA for approval; federal approval is still anticipated to be in June 2016; and additional public hearings will take place concurrently with public release of the Draft 2016 RTP/SCS.

4.5 <u>EPA Update</u>

Wienke Tax, EPA Region 9, reported that the EPA proposed reclassification of Marginal ozone nonattainment areas under 2008 8-hour ozone standard is anticipated to be completed in August 2015; and Imperial County is the only area to be reclassified from Marginal to Moderate in SCAG region under the proposed rule.

Karina O'Connor, EPA Region 9, reported the following:

- EPA can move forward with concurrence on San Bernardino County Associated Governments (SANBAG) TCM substitution first or together with Metro and Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) TCM substitutions if missing technical information for the latter two TCM substitutions would be submitted in time.
- EMFAC2014 is anticipated to be approved in Fall 2015, and EPA would work with FHWA to develop a grace period for the new model.
- An emission analysis that starts before or during the grace period has flexibility of using either EMFAC2011 or EMFAC2014; however, NEPA project level analyses are encouraged to use EMFAC2014 due to lengthy review process.

4.6 <u>ARB Update</u>

Heather Phillips, ARB, reported that all State Implementation Plan (SIP) activities are on schedule including those for South Coast.

4.7 <u>Air District Update</u>

Michael Krause, SCAQMD, reported the following:

- The last 2016 South Coast AQMP Advisory Group meeting was held on July 21, 2015.
- SCAQMD would submit a formal request to EPA for reclassifying South Coast Air Basin from Moderate to Serious nonattainment under 2006 24-hour PM_{2.5} national standard. The reclassification would extend attainment year.
- Originally designed to address 2008 8-hour Ozone and 2012 Annual PM_{2.5} national standards, 2016 South Coast AQMP will also include a new attainment demonstration for 2006 24 hour PM 2.5 standard as a result of the reclassification.
- With base year 2012 emission inventory almost complete, SCAQMD is moving forward with incorporating interim growth factors from SCAG for future year emission inventory.
- Eight of ten Draft 2016 AQMP White Papers have been released and are available online. At least eight Final Draft White Papers are anticipated to be presented to AQMP Advisory Group in September 2015.
- SCAQMD staff plans to discuss control measure concepts at next AQMP Advisory Group meeting on August 26, 2015.

Rongsheng Luo, SCAG, reported the following on behalf of Monica Soucier, Imperial County Air Pollution Control District (ICAPCD):

- ICAPCD has already started the preliminary data analysis for both 2008 8-hour Ozone and 2012 Annual PM_{2.5} standards.
- Primary focus of the data analysis is on the Annual PM_{2.5} standard as its SIP will be due before the Ozone SIP.
- Attainment demonstration has already commenced with ARB taking the lead in the analysis.
